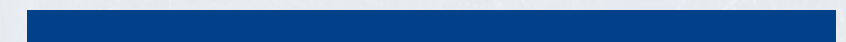

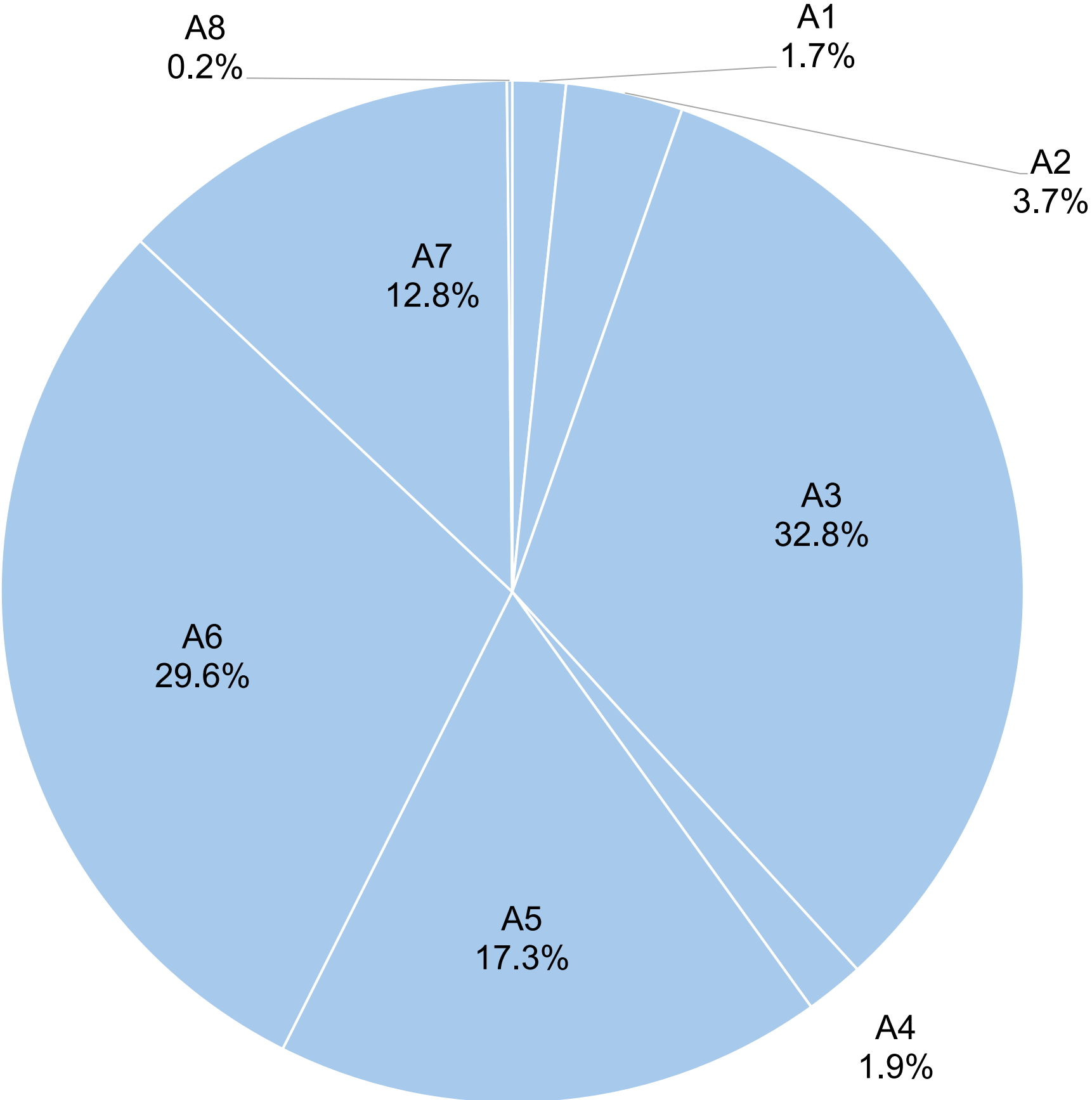

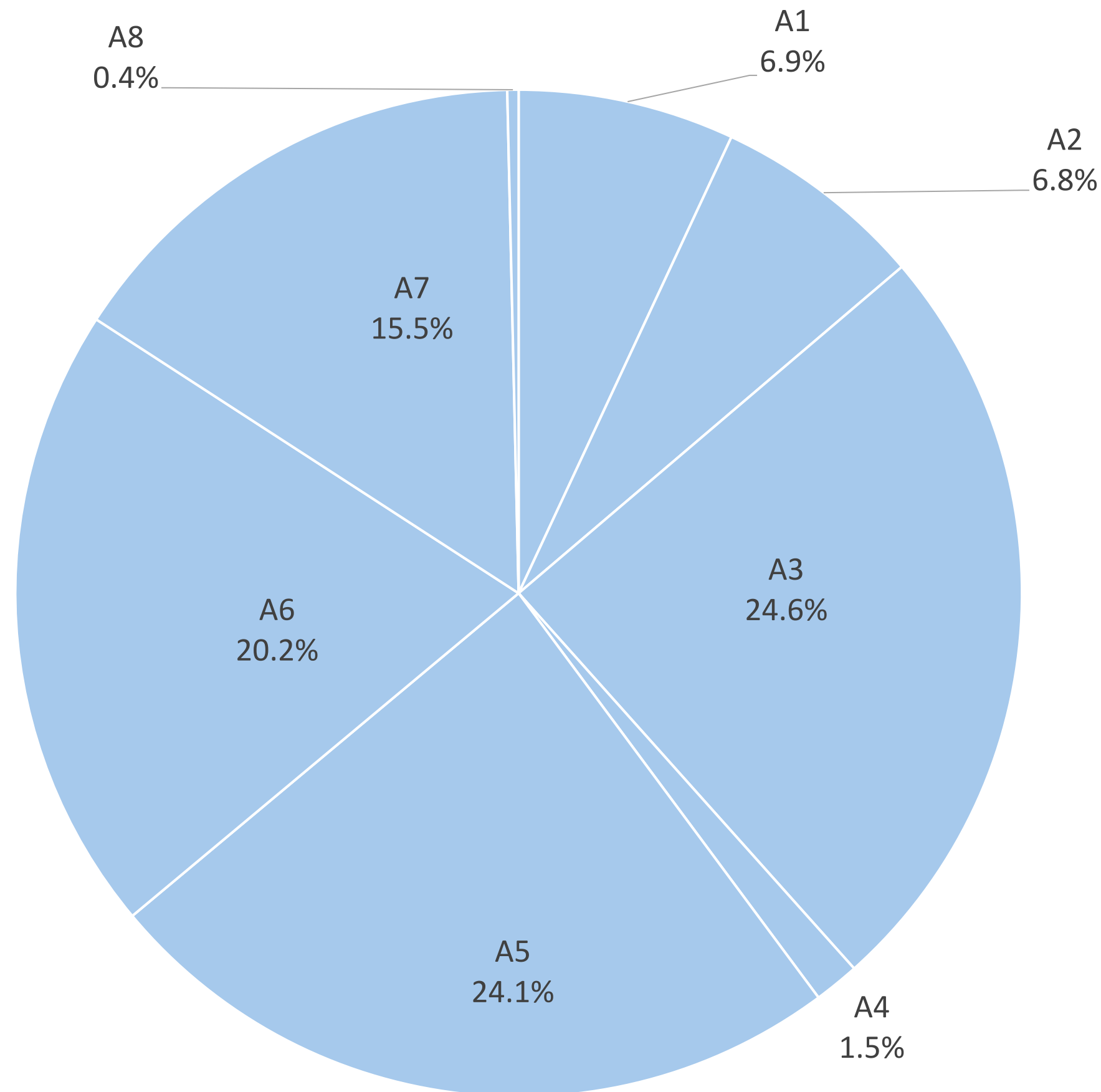

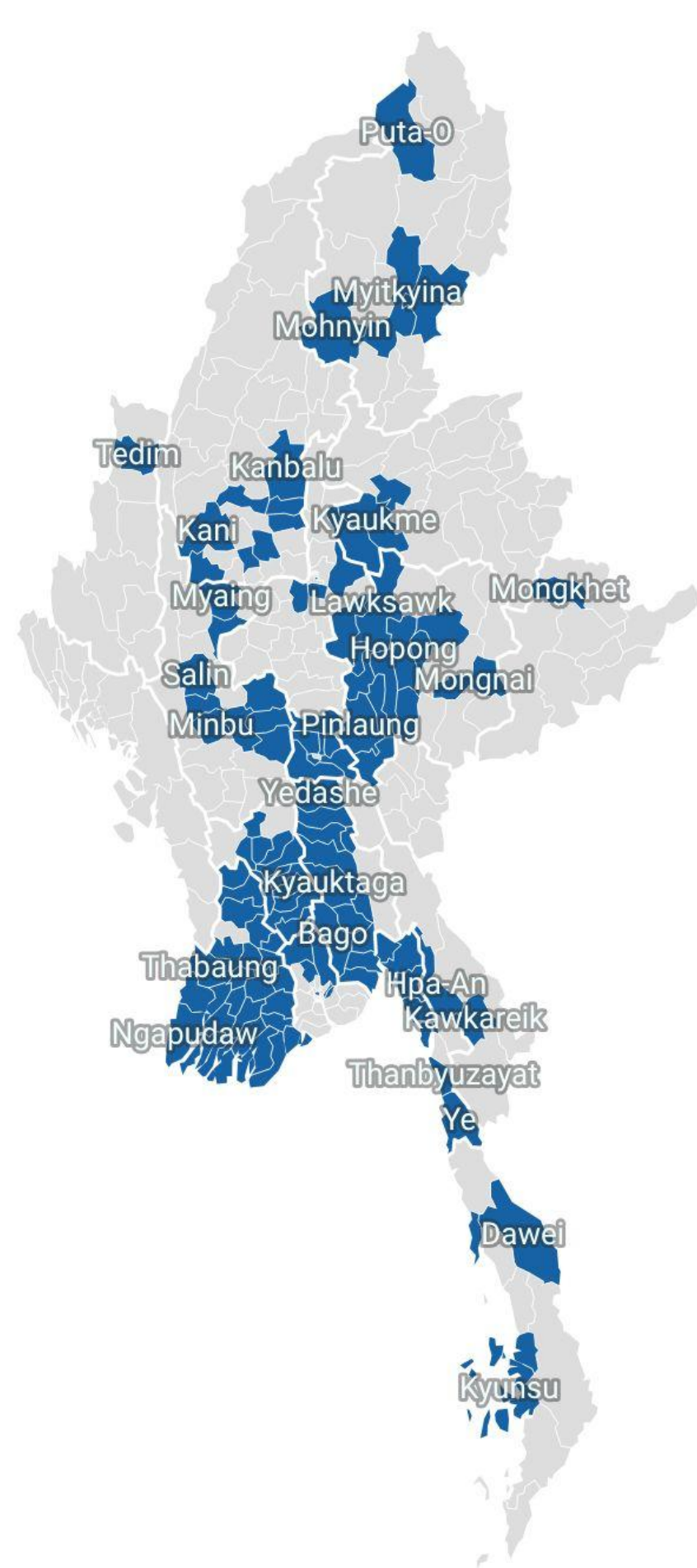

RBF+ Proposals are developed in two stages

Meeting with RBF+ Team to **develop** your Concept Idea (with / without the assistance of Service Providers)



STEP 02

Online Submission of Concept Note (with / without the assistance of Service Providers)



STEP 03

Screening by RBF+ Screening Committee



STEP 04

Approval of the Project Idea by RBF+ based on Qualifying Requirements



STAGE (2) FULL PROPOSAL STAGE

Preparation of Full Project Proposal with/without the assistance of Service Providers

Online Submission of Full Proposal

Guidelines for Completing the Concept Note

Role of Consultant/ Service Provider



Develop the project idea together with Business/MSME/Business Association to apply for RBF+'s (10) Areas of support.



Develop a quality Project Proposal together with the Business/MSME/Business Association which includes a detailed implementation plan with clear timelines and milestones, identifies desired economic outcomes for MSMEs and producers, assesses potential environmental benefits, etc



Carry out the financial feasibility of the project idea which includes estimations of investment and expenses, calculations of potential revenue or cost reductions, an estimated payback period, and accurate cost allocation for the requested RBF+ support.



Identify two or more equipment suppliers to ensure that the business is proposing the right technology, service, and cost-effective equipment for the Business/MSME/Business Association to implement the project.

Role of Consultant/ Service Provider



Develop a quality Project Proposal together with the Business/MSME/Business Association which includes a detailed implementation plan of the project idea within the timeframe, identifying desired economic outcomes for MSMEs and producers, assessing potential environmental benefits, etc.



Demonstrate the strong connection between RBF+'s areas and Supported Equipment/Technical Assistance etc.



Collect baseline data required for establishing the Monitoring and Evaluation requirements of the project and assist the Business/MSME/Business Association in the pre-grant agreement meetings with the RBF+ Team, which is a prerequisite for signing the grant agreement.



Advice Business/MSME/Business Association about the documentation required at least seven days ahead of the required submission date.

Role of Applicants (MSMEs)



Actively engage and collaborate with the proposal writer in identifying project ideas and developing the grant proposal/application.



Provide the proposal writer with all necessary information required for preparing and submitting the proposal in a timely manner.



Provide the proposal writer with a copy of the business license and all other required supporting documents at least five (5) days prior to the proposal submission deadline.
